JACQUES KLEIN, pianist

The celebrated Brazilian pianist, JACQUES KLEIN, returns to the New York concert scene, his first appearance here since the 1967 season.

Mr. Klein made his New York debut in 1959 at Town Hall, and appeared that same season with the New York Philharmonic, an event so successful that it resulted in an extensive tour of the United States the following season.

Born in Aracati, Brazil, Mr. Klein was launched upon his brilliant career in 1953, when he won the first prize at the Geneva International Competition, an honor which had not been awarded since 1948. Two years later, in 1955, he received the Harriet Cohen Medal in London, as the best young pianist of the year.

As a student Mr. Klein first came to the United States in 1950, where he studied with the late William Kapell. He continued his studies in Vienna with Bruno Seidlhofer.

In recent seasons Mr. Klein has been adding to his international reputation through his numerous appearances throughout Europe and South America.
