Luli Oswald International Guest Artist



Among famed Polish pianist Arthur Rubinstein's many contributions to the music world is his daughter Luli Oswald, a master pianist in her own right. When she was 14, Ms. Oswald learned that the brilliant man, whom she regarded as a close family friend and music mentor, was her father. She was raised in Brazil by adoptive parents Odoardo and Maria Oswald, but Rubinstein was a frequent visitor who oversaw his daughter's formal piano instruction.

Ms. Oswald's piano studies began at age three. At nine, she studied with the Spanish master Tomas Teran. She graduated from the Brazilian Conservatory of Music of Rio de Janeiro with a degree in piano, theory and harmony.

She has performed, taught, lectured and judged music competitions around the world. Ms. Oswald's performances include presentations with National and Foreign Orchestras executing concerts for piano and orchestra from Chopin, Beethoven, Brahms, Rachmaninoff, Saint Saens, Liszt, Mozart and others. She has given performances at the Concert-Gebouw, the Tokyo Symphony Orchestra, the Arcady Music Festival and the Orquesta Sinfonica del Estado de Mexico.

She also served as a juror for the selection of the best pianist of the year at the Music National School of the University of Brazil, and she was invited by the Foreign Relations Ministry to stand for Brazil as an official observer in the first Van Cliburn Piano Competition, and has juried many international piano competitions.
